We have been actively engaging with the council and ORCA made a submission on the latest draft Long Term Plan. Surprise, surprise Onemana did get two mentions with money budgeted in future years for a water storage upgrade and a playground upgrade...fingers crossed. Our submission can be found on our website. We did take a very pragmatic approach to our submission knowing that the Council is under some stress due to weather events, but equally counseled the need for them to be financially prudent and restrained. Attached to our submission is a list of things that our community told us were important to Onemana and while these aren't necessarily significant to the council they are important to us.

We have also joined the Alliance of Community Groups to liaise with the Council on ongoing matters and **Ruhi Pene** reported that so far it has had a constructive start. Time will tell how it evolves and hopefully we can make a meaningful contribution.

As a result time and money is being regularly spent to replace the ropes etc and its sad to see that people can't see the damage that the easterly winds and swells have done to our beach front and why this is vital to protect it for future generations.

There have also been a couple of incidents with poachers which may have caught your attention. Please be vigilant but also remember people are allowed to take fish and shellfish provided they comply with the rules so don't be vigilante be a good citizen.

Rats... they are back in numbers and with the colder weather will soon be venturing inside. ORCA provides rat bait to those who need it so if you do please contact
