We have had a number of people expressing concern about the riding of motorised bikes on the reserves. If you see this happening please contact the police as ORCA has no more authority than any member of the public to restrain these people. On a similar unsavoury note we have had one of our sets of Christmas lights and the solar panels stripped from the pohutukawa and stolen. It's again a reminder that we aren't immune here from such things and if you do see people behaving badly or breaking the law take a photo and report them to the police.
